








### FLOOR PLAN, DIMENSIONS & MAP



#### THE LOCATION

This attractive property is located near the centre of Tain, Scotland's oldest Royal Burgh. Tain is well served by supermarkets but unusually still retains many small family businesses in the High Street. A modern health centre has just been opened nearby with Craighill Primary School and Tain Royal Academy, a short walk away. A regular commuter train links Inverness to the South and Wick and Thurso to the North. The drive to Inverness takes approximately 50 minutes via the nearby A9 trunk road (part of the popular North Coast 500 (NC500) scenic driving route.







The Scottish Highlands are renowned for its outdoor pursuits with easy access from Inverness to the year-round sports playground of The Cairngorm National Park. The easily accessible North-West Highlands is often referred to as the last great wilderness in Europe and the area boasts some of the most beautiful beaches and mountains in Scotland.

Tain Golf Course, designed by Old Tom Morris, presents a stiff challenge for golfers with the world-famous links at Royal Dornoch but a short drive away. Tain is also the home of the 16 Men of Tain from the iconic Glenmorangie Distillery.
